



Scholarship Guidelines

The Manor Education Foundation Program Committee annually awards scholarships in the amount of \$1,250.00 per year to Manor ISD graduates for a maximum of four years. Graduates may receive scholarship assistance to attend an accredited or otherwise approved Post-Secondary Educational or Training Institution (P.S.E.T.I.). This may include a four-year college or university, two-year junior college, technical school, or other institution from which a certificate of completion prepares its holder to capably enter the workplace and have skills conducive to continued growth and self-sufficiency.

The Program Committee uses a blind screening process (identities of applicants unknown), and evaluates applicants' strengths and records in order to determine award recipients. In order to be a candidate for award consideration, applicants must:

- Be a graduating senior from Manor ISD
- Have attended a Manor secondary campus for at least two years
- Have proven, unquestionable moral character
- Show leadership potential and a proven track record
- Plan to attend an accredited or otherwise approved Post-Secondary Educational or Training Institution (P.S.E.T.I.)
- Intend to be a full-time student (12 credit hours minimum, if pursuing two or four-year degrees)
- Be able to maintain good academic standing

Financial need may be considered, but will not alone determine scholarship approval.
